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Background

Care City is a centre for improving healthy ageing and regeneration for East London. We are based in Barking. We work as an innovation partner to East London's health and care system, bringing partners from across health, social care the third sector, research and industry together to deliver improvements for our local community. Everything we do is about understanding the causes of poor health in our local area and working to improve health.

On 1 June 2019 Care City became a Community Interest Company (CIC), leaving our founders and initial funders North East London NHS Foundation Trust and the London Borough of Barking and Dagenham. As a CIC we can focus on the good for the community, not for profit shares and ensure that our vision and moral purpose are firmly rooted in the local community.


We are excited to launch the recruitment to our Community Board, to build further on our commitment to user collaboration and ensure that the community is the centre of all that we do.

Care City Community Board

Our Community Board will help us to shape, review and challenge our work. It will include local residents, patients, carers, and staff from the voluntary sector, care and health agencies – people who have professional and / or lived experience and can bring that expertise to the Board.

The Community Board will be embedding the patient, carer and public within Care City's decision-making processes to ensure our work is led by the people we serve. We will see the Board evolving over time and are open to growth in order to facilitate support and connection at different levels of intensity across our programme of work as appropriate.

At this first stage we are looking to appoint up to six members to form the initial Board. Appointed members will bring diverse experience, understanding and skills to Care City CIC and will be expected to reflect on further growth of the Community Board to diversify voice, experience or skills.



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Length of the role

Two years, with the potential for extension or renewal through mutual agreement with the chair.

Meeting schedule

During the pandemic, meetings are being held virtually via Zoom for an hour, every two months. We hope that in the future these meetings can take place in person at our Care City offices in Barking.

Honoraria and expenses

Community Board members will be offered an honorarium (payment) for their time at a rate of £50 per meeting / half day. Care City CIC will cover reasonable travel, and accommodation where appropriate, expenses where agreed in advance. Reimbursement for other expenses, including care responsibilities, may be agreed at the discretion of Care City CIC.

- Respect the viewpoints of others in the group
